Theft a key issue


Almost three-quarters (73%) of surveyed stores experienced theft in the last 12 months

79% of businesses that have been stolen from within the last year say the frequency or **severity** of the theft has gone up

Just 8% of reported shop theft incidents lead to a prosecution, with almost half of respondents (47%) not reporting the incidents at all

experienced shop theft within the last 12 months say that it occurred during opening hours
